SECTION 4: First-aid Measures

4.1 Description of First Aid Measures

GENERAL NOTES: When symptoms persist or in all cases of doubt seek medical advice. Show this safety data sheet to the doctor in attendance.

7.1 Precautions for safe handling

Repeated or prolonged skin contact may cause skin irritation and/or dermatitis and sensitization of susceptible persons.
