## SECTION 4: First-aid Measures

### 4.1 Description of First Aid Measures

**GENERAL NOTES:** When symptoms persist or in all cases of doubt seek medical advice. Show this safety data sheet to the doctor in attendance. Remove contaminated clothing and shoes.
